<p><b>brachiating</b> <b>(gibbons)</b> Note: Spider monkeys also brachiate and are referred to as “semi-brachiators.”</p>	<p><b>buttress roots</b> <b>(trees)</b></p>
<p><b>drip tip</b> <b>(leaves)</b></p>	<p><b>eye-spots</b> <b>(blue morpho butterfly)</b></p>
<p><b>elongated head</b> <b>and larynx</b> <b>(hammer-headed bat)</b></p>	<p><b>forked tongue</b> <b>(Amazonian boa)</b></p>
<p><b>pharyngeal pouch</b> <b>(elephants)</b></p>	<p><b>prehensile tail</b> <b>(spider monkeys)</b> Note: Some geckos also have prehensile tails.</p>
<p><b>proboscis</b> <b>(blue morpho butterfly)</b></p>	<p><b>setae</b> <b>(geckos)</b> Note: Butterflies also have setae.</p>
