



# Letter Identification BINGO

Enjoy the fun of BINGO while reinforcing letter identification and learning to discriminate between letters.

## How To:

### Provided:

- Letter Identification BINGO sign graphic - 17" x 11"
- SUPER WHY BINGO cards - 8.5" x 11"
- SUPER WHY place markers - 8.5" x 11"

### Supplied by You:

- Letter cards that act as "BINGO balls"

Laminate the SUPER WHY BINGO cards and place marker sheets to ensure durability, then cut the markers into individual squares. Distribute the BINGO cards and give each child a pile of markers. Sit children in a semi-circle around the moderator.

The moderator will call out BINGO letters. Use the skill level options below to determine letter identification method.

## SKILL LEVEL OPTIONS

- Level 1:** Moderator pulls a letter card and says its name.
- Level 2:** Moderator pulls a letter card and asks participants to label the letter.
- Level 3:** Each child takes a turn pulling a letter card and labeling it.

Once the letter is called based upon the skill level options above, have children use the SUPER WHY place markers to cover the correct letter on their own SUPER WHY BINGO cards. If there is a secondary moderator, have him or her look over children's cards to ensure correct letter identification. When a child covers three squares in a row, he or she will shout "BINGO". Once the card has been reviewed as correct, children can trade SUPER WHY BINGO cards and begin another round with all new letters. Have children create additional formations with their SUPER WHY place markers, including Four Corners or Around the Perimeter.
